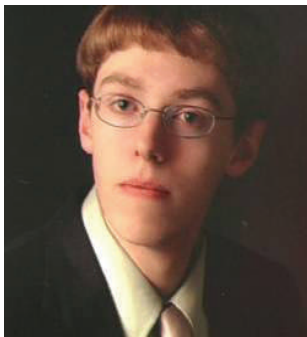

Gilbert Vance Achievements Acknowledged

Gilbert Vance, Central '38 retired from 1st Source Bank in 1983, yet his enormous inspirational impact is still felt today. He began working in the Bank's Trust Department right after graduation from Central High School, but a few years later he was stationed in Australia assigned to General Douglas MacArthur's staff during WWII. He returned to South Bend following the war and a few years later rejoined the bank. In 1956 he was named senior Vice-President gaining the confidence and respect of his clients by his strong work ethic. A man with a renowned sense of humor he is known as a person who has a passion for excellence and is very committed to a clients welfare. "I surrounded myself with a lot of good, smart people and...they worked hard to help their clients....". Gil served on the board of directors of several companies in his career and currently he and his wife, Bev, live on the south side of South Bend. Despite some health issues, Gil still enjoys seeing and talking with old friends. 'I loved the Bank', he said, 'it was a great place to work'.

Comments from the Superintendent



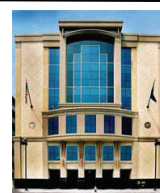

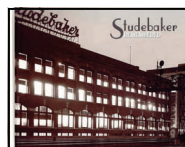

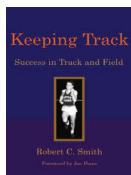
Studebaker Remembered

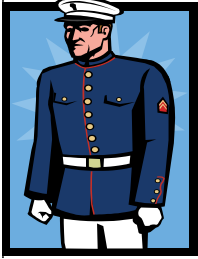

Alumni Profile

Robert "Beans" VanCamp grew up on the near east side of town. He attended Jefferson School and was a familiar face around School Field for the activities and sports events.

He graduated from Central High School in 1941 and served in the U.S. Marine Corps. He cherished his Marine Corp. experience and his association with the service. He saw active duty in WWII in the Pacific theatre. After the war he entered Ball State University in Muncie and earned his degree in Mathematics & Physical Education. He returned to South Bend to devote his entire career here. His first assignment was at Muessel School where he coached the football team to many successful seasons. He transferred to Washington High School changing his allegiance from the Bears to the Panthers and served under head coach Tom Roggeman for 11 years. When Roggeman left to coach at Purdue University, VanCamp succeeded him as head coach. He had many successful seasons at Washington and won the first Indiana State Football Championship in 1973. The number of notable student-athletes who participated in his program is long and impressive. Many of his players played at the college level and a few in the NFL. 'Beaner', as he calls himself, also coached Track & Field at Muessel and Washington with equal success. An aggressive competitor himself he loves to compete and was active in Class A fast-pitch softball for many years. He turned to golf after retirement in 1981 to the surprise of many of his friends. Always the organizer he coordinated a retiree golf group for many years, pairing players and making course arrangements.

Not a one dimensional man he built a greenhouse onto his home and raised flower and vegetable plants from seed for his own garden and for his many friends. He and his wife, Jerry, were married for 51 years until her death in 1999. He and Jerry have two children. Jill Marsh a teacher in South Bend and son Dee Kevin living in Newport, Rhode Island.

Parting Note

When the Alumni Association was conceived in 1985 it was thought we would have the financial support of our mission by Alumni without 'badgering' members to donate; we were true to that belief—unfortunately the results have been poor. To date we have granted, loaned, awarded, given to students, schools over a half million dollars, most of which was the result of fund raising by the staff, some board members soliciting businesses and a few generous individual donors.
